Another Christian lady named Hanna had taught sewing in our school for more than 20 years until about 10 years ago when she had to retire because of Alzheimer's. It was during those years that Sister Hadera learned to sew and embroidery using a pedal driven sewing machine. She now shares her skills with the deaf children as a volunteer teacher. This training will enable these students to be employed as tailors and to make beautiful decorated clothing to be sold at the market place. When they graduate from our school and go on to a government High School, they will be able to support themselves. Sister Hadera is using what God has blessed her with to benefit the lives of others.

## WATER WELL PROGRAM UPDATE:

This month our drilling crew was able to finish the 14 remaining wells in the Badewatcho District. This completed the 40 well agreement we had made with the Southern Region Water Bureau and UNICEF. The crew is installing pumps so that the people can have pure clean water to drink. Our Ethiopian crew completed 34 of the 40 wells without having Curt King with them. This is a very positive step and is a demonstration of the fine training Curt has

provided for our crew. The process of making a new 40 well agreement which would start in November is underway. There are many congregations of the Churches of Christ in the Badewatcho District and we believe many of our members will use water from these 14 new wells.
