## **MILESTONES IN THE LIVES OF THESE MEMBERS:**



Tilahun Azagegn Ph.D. became a Christian more than 10 years ago. He first came to the church as a World Bible School student. Ministers at the Addis Ababa congregation studied with him and he obeyed the gospel and was added to the Lord's Church. At that time he was a university student studying geology. He went to work for the Federal Water Bureau following his graduation. He continued his education and obtained an M.A. in Geology. In June, 2015 he graduated with a Ph.D. Degree in Hydro Geology. He has been an important part of our water well program and has volunteered his professional skills to write project proposals and to do necessary reports when the drilling agreements are completed. He has grown spiritually over the years and has become a respected member of the Mekanissa congregation. It is a great

blessing to have Dr. Tilahun working with us and his willingness to spend hours and days without compensation to help us provide good water in rural Ethiopia.

### **BROTHER MOGES REPORTS ABOUT TEACHING AT THE UNIVERSITY:**



"We have been invited many times to teach at the Addis Ababa University. These students assemble once a week to study and to pray. They come from different faiths. It is because of

one of our students, Abraham Delkeso, that we are invited there to teach. It seems they like our teaching but they still do not respond to the gospel. Many of them have become World Bible School Amharic students. Even though I teach very fundamental lessons of the gospel and they seem very pleased with what they hear; until now we see no action from them. We will continue our teaching and we pray that some of them will respond in the near future. ### **A NEW HOUSE CHURCH IN ADDIS ABABA:**



A new congregation was established last year in the home of Sister Zenebech. It is located in the Kore district of the city. Sister Zenebech has been a member of the Lord's church for 46 years. Public transportation on weekends is limited and very expensive for the incomes of normal people, so Abraham Delkeso volunteered to go there each Lord's Day to teach. Other men from the Mekanissa church help him. Plans are going forward to establish more home churches so that

members who live long distances from the Mekanissa congregation can gather for worship and invite their friends and neighbors. The Sudanese congregation was established in Brother Roger Walker's home in 1995 and has been an active body of the church since that time in the Kabena area of the city.
