"RETRAINING THE OLDER PREACHERS"







Pictured above are 35 preachers and 14 teachers at the Level One Preacher Training Schools in Jajura, Santariea and Shone. The leaders felt the need to bring back brethren; some who have been preaching more than 40 years to study, discuss and encourage one another. There will be three one month training sessions and a total of 105 will have attended the studies when the program is complete. This will be only the second time this kind of study program has been conducted in the 25 year history of these three schools. The subjects taught and discussed are:

- How to evangelize in their own areas.
- How to counter the false teaching being promoted through the new media in Ethiopia.
- The absolute need for church leadership.
- How to teach congregations about their responsibility to support their own preachers.
- How they can use their own life experiences to mentor young preachers.
- The need for them to be an example of successful evangelism and spiritual growth.
- How to handle problems and teach other leaders how to handle problems in churches.
- How to more effectively use the Solar Audio Bible Units in their own personal study and in teaching God's word to others.
- How to teach members and churches to be better financial stewards.

TWO PREACHERS: 74 YEARS OF COMBINED EXPERIENCE

Tesfaye Ashamo serves as the minister of the Moloto, Soro congregation. He has been preaching for 40 years and is widely known throughout the church in Ethiopia. He has two sons that are graduates of the Jajura School of Preaching and serve with him in Moloto. He has six nephews, all graduates of the Jajura School and two of them also completed the Level Two Preaching School in Addis Ababa. Tesfaye's family is a preaching family! Tesfaye was baptized in 1972 by the late Petro Basore; one of the 1968

graduates of the first preacher training school in Addis Ababa. <u>Brother Ermias</u> has served the church in Hangeda, Katcha Birra for 34 years. He was baptized in 1981 by the late Belete Melsebo, a graduate of the 2nd 1968 session of the Addis Ababa Preacher Training School. These two men are attending the one month refresher course at the Jajura School of Preaching and are examples of what God can do with dedicated men who serve Him.

WATER WELL DRILLING IN LESS THAN GOOD WEATHER:







The seasonal rains came early again this year making it very difficult to get to the sites that have been assigned for our crew to drill. On the left the support truck is about to cross what looks like a simple low spot in the trail. However, the dry dirt is only a few inches deep; then it turns to mud. Wide strips of heavy rubber mat are put down to allow the trucks and rig to pass without sinking into the slimy mud. Just a small amount of rain will make it impossible to go back through this place after the drilling is completed. It is a stressful time. When the rig and trucks arrive at a site, a crowd always gathers to watch and cheer. Many pray all the time the drilling continues. On the right the crew is busy with the work. When conditions are good, an average of two wells can be completed each week. A problem came up with one of the hydraulic tanks. One of the crew sent a text to Curt King in Seattle telling him what they were facing and Curt answered right back with the needed solution. This kind of communication in this part of the world is amazing! Supplying pure clean water is a lifesaving blessing for the Ethiopian people.
