GOSPEL MEETING AT MOLOTO, SORO



The church in Ethiopia is growing and spreading as never before according to a report received from Bro. Behailu. The church in Moloto was established in the 70's and has hundreds of members. Three of the Addis Ababa Bible Training Institute students also attended and were speakers. Left to right: Abayenhe Abraham, Behailu Yoseph, and Temesgen Tumebo. Two of these brethren live in the Soro area. Behailu Yoseph lives and serves in the Dawro area in southern Ethiopia now but lived in Soro most of his life. He and his father moved to Dawro when the government resettled thousands of the Soro people to that remote area. Hundreds

of church members were resettled, and they knew the members would need to be organized into new congregations during the dispersion. These are exciting times for all the churches and brethren throughout rural Ethiopia!

then had Ethiopian bread and coffee together. The church in Katcha Birra was established in 1969 by an evangelist named Belete Melsebo. Another brother named Zecharias worked with him in those early days. The church building was constructed on land given to the church by the father of Zecharias. This congregation now has five trained gospel preachers working with the church. Over the years it has faced many attacks. In the mid 70's the Pentecostal movement led many of their young people away. Later the Anti-institutional brethren infiltrated them and divided the church. With the passing of Brother Belete, the new strong leaders stood firmly. One of them is Brother Paulos (upper left picture second from left in grey coat). Paulos and others are still there. This church is also referred to as the "Masafe Church" because of the area where it is located. There is a very rich history of the church all over Kambatta, Hydia, Wollieta and Badewatcho. Hundreds of congregations are located in these areas.

WATER PROJECT UPDATE:



The water well drilling project is a very important ministry. We can know that by the number of obstacles Satan puts in our way! Three months ago the clutch drive on the Schramm rig engine broke. We immediately started looking for a new clutch assembly and finally located one at a company in Wausau, WS. After a few more delays it arrived in Ethiopia and Monte Hininger left on March 20th for Ethiopia to do the repairs, which are extensive. The rig was moved to Hawassa and is on the Deaf School compound. If things went well the work should have been completed in three or four days and the rig was returned to the drilling area by the time you receive this report. The new rig had a fuel supply problem and a factory mechanic came from India to locate the problem and repair it. We will report in our next month's newsletter if these efforts were successful.
